Here is how to sign up for access on a computer.

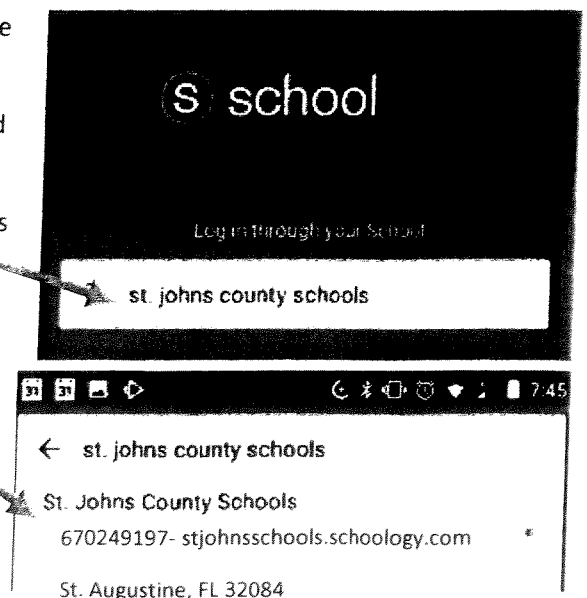

You can also access Schoology on your phone. Make sure you follow these directions carefully.

1. Go to iTunes (iPhones) or to the Google Play Store (Android). Download and install the app.
2. Open the app and it will ask for your school or domain. Type in St. Johns County Schools
3. A listing will come up and you will want to select this one that has St. Augustine as the city.
4. You will follow the same directions as above with a computer login... first page you will enter your s number @stjohns.k12.fl.us
5. It will redirect you and then you will type in your s number and Home Access Password



BTHS Community Service Hours Guidelines

Community service hours are required for all Bright Futures Scholarship Awards – Florida academic Scholars, Florida Medallion Scholars and Gold Seal Vocational Scholars: 100, 75 and 30 hours respectively. **You may begin logging your hours the summer before your freshman year. Community service hours must be documented by a verification letter that is on letterhead of the place where the hours were served, the number of hours earned, a description of the volunteer work as well as a contact name and telephone number that can be used to verify the hours. Parent and student signatures are also required on the bottom of each letter.**

Below are some examples of hours that are considered Community Service:

- Service to a government agency
- Service to a non-profit local, national or international organization
 - When training meetings are required prior to the actual service, a student can receive credit for up to 2 hours of training in addition to the hours of service.
- Service to a school or school organization – in which credit is not being awarded
- Service to a religious organization
- Participation in non-profit Fine Arts performances or exhibitions
 - When hours are being earned in which rehearsal time is required, a student can receive credit for up to 3 hours of rehearsal time for every hour of performance time.
- VPS hours provided credit is not being awarded
- Non-paid internships at a non-profit organization with prior school official approval
- Career Academy non-paid internships

Below are some examples of hours that are **not** considered eligible for Community Service:

- Family related activities
- Hours in which students are compensated either monetarily or materially
- School related activities that have required attendance and /or are a part of the course requirement to earn credit
- Attendance at meetings which are required as part of memberships in a club or organization
- Activities that cannot be documented on business letterhead
- Volunteer services for – profit businesses
