

Approved Two-Piece Prom Dress Styles

We understand that the trend of Prom Dresses 2015 consist of 2-piece dresses. In lieu of this style, we have modified the dress code to adapt to this new trend. We have organized the following examples with explanations as to what is “appropriate” and what is not.

These are just EXAMPLES. We ask that you use good judgment.

Here are a few “rules of thumb”:

- (1) Length: Dress must not be shorter than mid thigh, even while dancing.
- (2) Midriff: only a sliver can show (2” maximum) and absolutely NO BELLY BUTTONS.
- (3) Necklines: Should not dip lower than your chest.
- (4) Backline: Dresses with an open back may not dip lower than the natural waist line.

The following dresses are appropriate:



Necklines are modest.
Midriff is 1-2 inches.
Length is appropriate.



- Neckline is modest.
- Midriff is 1-2 inches.
- Length is appropriate.
- Back is long enough.



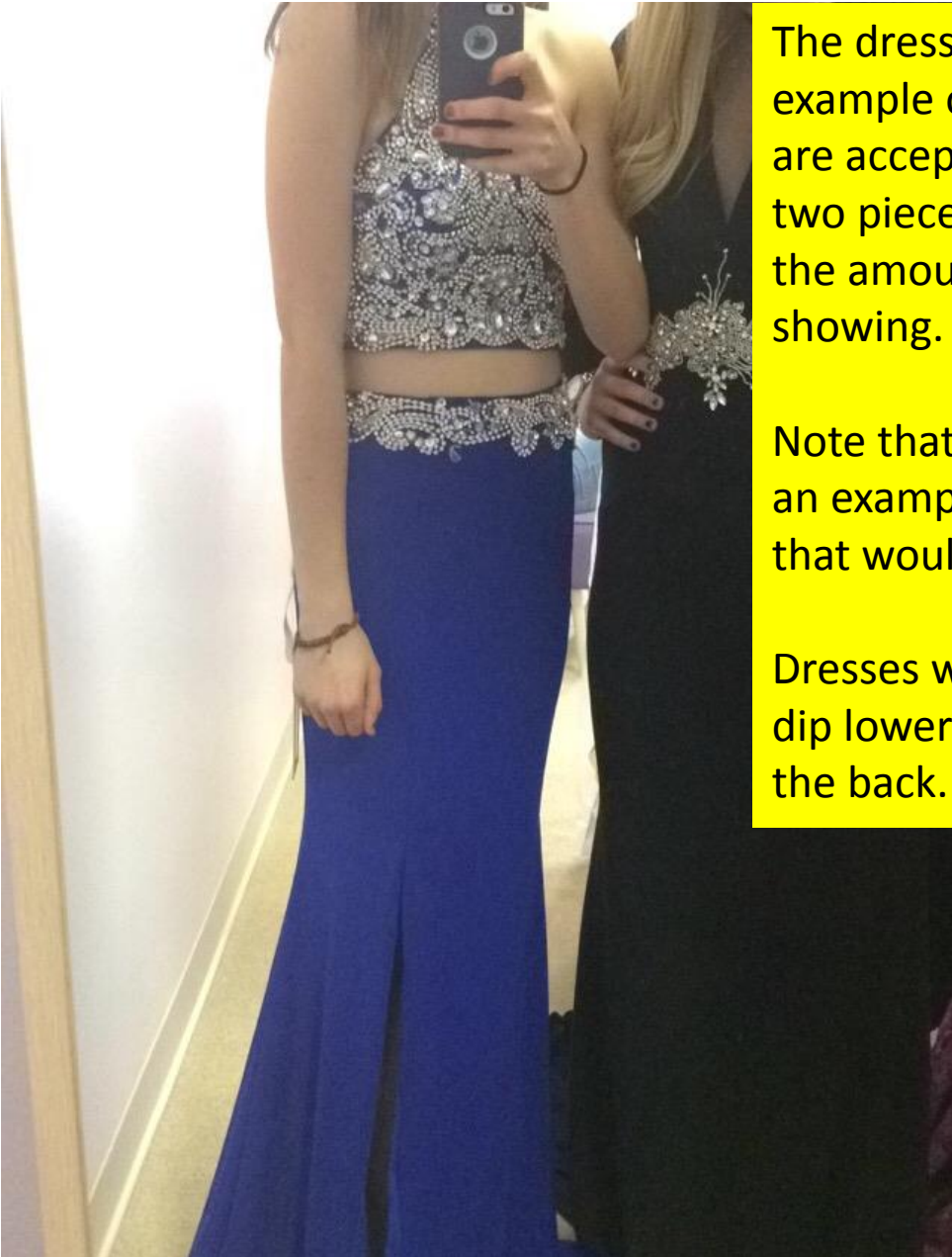

The dresses pictured offer an example of the types of dresses we are accepting. Note that the blue two piece dress (on left) is modest in the amount of tummy that is showing.

Note that the black dress (on right) is an example of the ***most extreme cut*** that would be acceptable.

Dresses with an open back may not dip lower than the natural waist on the back.



Dresses that are NOT appropriate



No belly buttons should be showing.

Length is too short.

Not appropriate



Necklines are TOO LOW or
expose too much.
Midriff is more than 2".
Slit must go to mid thigh.



Not appropriate



Too much midriff is exposed.

Must be only 1-2"





Although neckline and length are in accordance to the dress code, the midriff is too much and shows the belly button.

NOT APPROPRIATE

Not appropriate



- Blue dress: midriff is more than 1-2" and dress is in danger of being too short.
- Purple dress: too short, neckline is too low, and overall, too much skin is showing to be deemed appropriate.

As you know, the dresses pictured are just some examples of 2-piece styles.

We are excited for this event and we want you to be as well. BTHS expects all guests to act and dress in a manner that upholds our Prom as a formal and special high school evening.

If you choose a dress that is beyond these limits, you risk not being allowed to participate. The administration may deny entry if your outfit is deemed inappropriate for a high school prom.
