

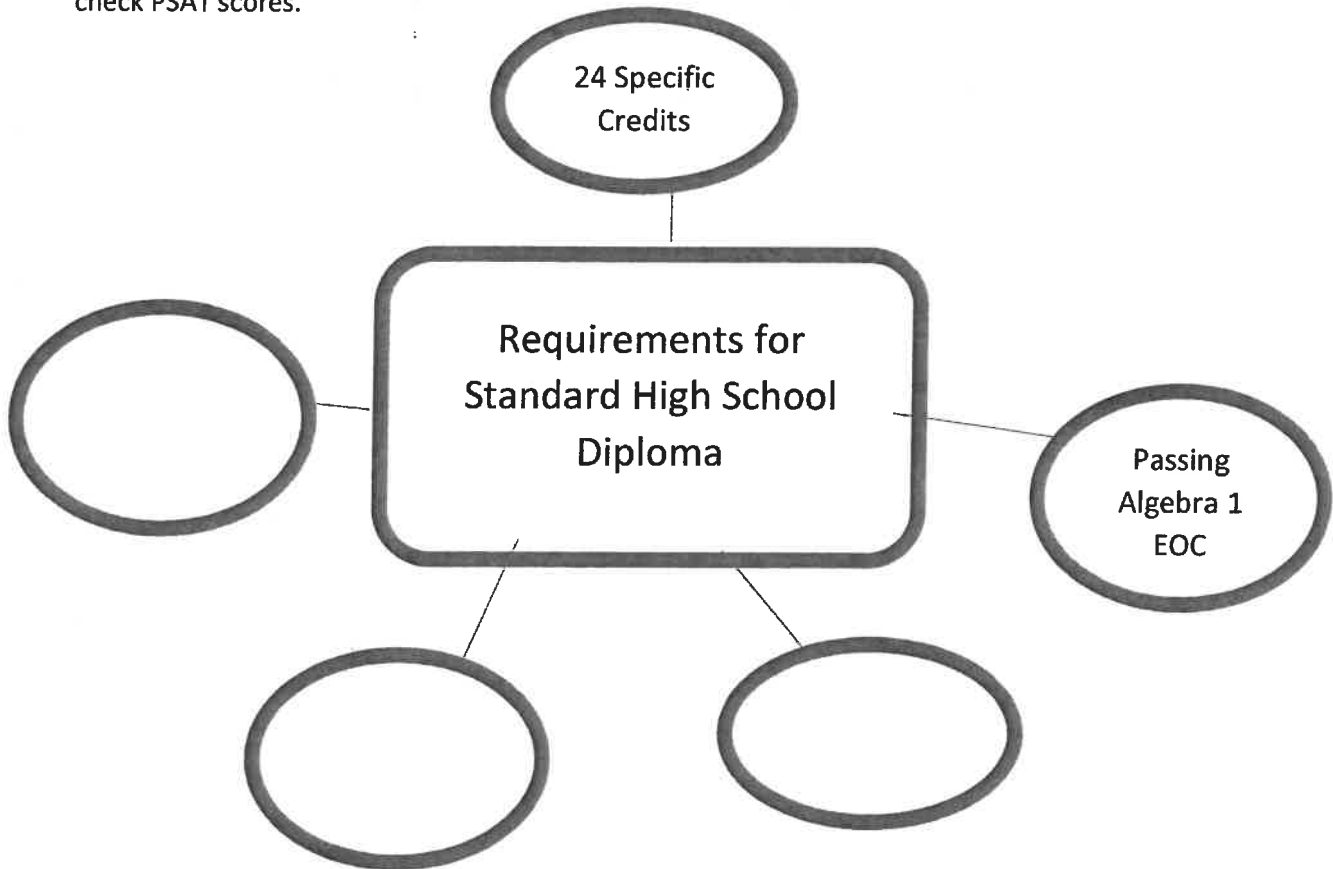

2. College and Career Information

- A. Begin the search process now – www.collegescorecard.ed.gov
 - a. Make a list of colleges or other postsecondary opportunities that are interesting to you
 - b. Request information about each college and if possible visit colleges that you are interested in during your Junior year
- B. Attend the NACAC (National College Fair) – October 12; 9 am – 1 pm; Prime Osborn Convention Center, Jacksonville, FL
- C. Go to: www.floridashines.org and <https://sjrstate.emsicc.com/> to get information about careers, degrees, and college application process.

3. Traditional Dual Enrollment - <https://www-bths.stjohns.k12.fl.us/guidance/dual/>

- A. If you qualify for traditional dual enrollment, you can begin taking classes in 11th grade
- B. Work on getting (or keeping) your unweighted, cumulative GPA at or over a 3.0

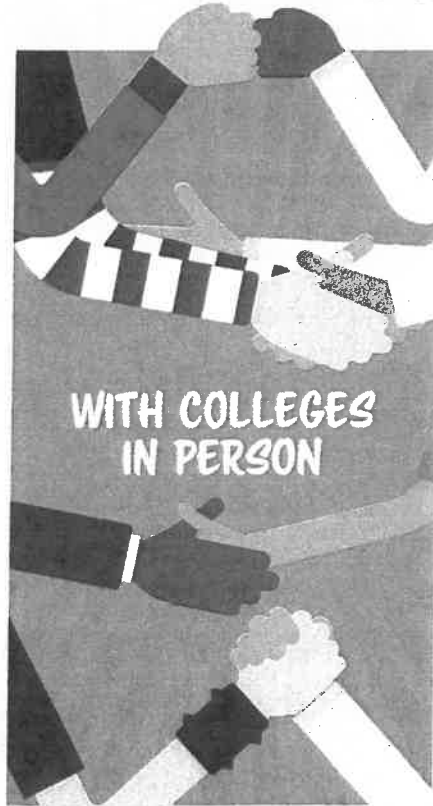

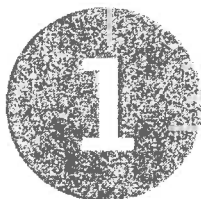

May, Grade 11

- Pay attention to due date for fall off campus SJRSC dual enrollment paperwork, including qualifying GPA and test scores, due to the guidance office

Throughout HS

- Students should maintain a 3.0 or higher unweighted, cumulative GPA

February, Grade 10

- Pay attention to due date for summer and on BTHS campus dual enrollment paperwork, including qualifying GPA and test scores due to the guidance office

January, Grade 10

- Pay attention to announcements/ email for date of mandatory meeting students should attend if interested in on BTHS campus dual enrollment

October, Grade 11

- Pay attention to due date for spring off campus SJRSC dual enrollment paperwork, including qualifying GPA and test scores, due to the guidance office

October, Grade 12

- Pay attention to due date for spring off campus SJRSC dual enrollment paperwork, including qualifying GPA and test scores due to the guidance office

DEADLINE

Students should have a complete set of qualifying placement test scores if they want to participate in either summer off campus SJRSC DE or on campus DE for 11th grade

May, Grade 10

- Pay attention to due date for fall off campus SJRSC dual enrollment paperwork, including qualifying GPA and test scores, due to the guidance office

February, Grade 11

- Pay attention to due date for summer off campus SJRSC dual enrollment paperwork, including qualifying GPA and test scores, due to the guidance office

All dual enrollment students, including Collegiate HS, must always maintain a 3.0 unweighted, cumulative GPA to continue taking college courses

Where can your test scores take you?

The standardized tests you take in high school (ACT, SAT, PERT, PSAT) can be applied to many different areas of your academic world. You can use them for FSA ELA Concordant scores, Algebra 1 EOC Concordant scores, to gain admissions into college, and to earn scholarship dollars! Use the chart below to help set and keep track of your goals.

BTHS Post-Secondary Readiness Milestones

9th Grade

- Explore career and college opportunities on www.bigfuture.collegeboard.org
- Attend the NACAC College Fair in October as well as other college and career fairs in the area.
- Participate in and track extracurricular activities: sports, clubs, and community service (required for Bright Futures scholarships).
- Turn completed community service hour letters to the school counseling office.
- Create a Raise.Me account to start earning scholarships.
- Start thinking about life after high school; talk to people about careers you might find interesting.
- Look for a summer job, internship or volunteer position to help you learn about your field of interest.

10th Grade

- Explore career and college opportunities on www.bigfuture.collegeboard.org
- Students with disabilities need to apply for PSAT/ACT/SAT/AP test accommodations (specific deadlines and requirements apply)- www.collegeboard.com/ssd/student/index.html and ACT: www.actstudent.org/regist/disab/
- Take the PSAT in October (FREE- for 10th graders).
- Attend the NACAC College Fair in October as well as other college and career fairs in the area.
- Review your PSAT score report with your parents (Dec/Jan). PSAT scores are in your CollegeBoard account.
- Link your CollegeBoard and Khan account to receive personalized practice recommendations for SAT based on PSAT results.
- Attend information session for Dual Enrollment to understand application deadlines, process, and requirements (Jan).
- Take the PERT if you are interested in Dual Enrollment classes your junior year <http://www.sjrst.edu/testingcenter.html>.
- Visit at least 3 college or other postsecondary websites to review programs, admissions requirements, freshman profile, costs, and AP equivalents.
- Keep up participation in school activities and volunteer efforts and keep tracking your progress.
- Update your Raise.Me account to keep earning scholarships
- Check your Bright Futures gpa online in March and July <https://www.floridashines.org/go-to-college/pay-for-college>.
- Turn completed community service hour letters to the school counseling office.
- Look for a job, internship or volunteer position to help you learn about your field of interest.

11th Grade - FALL

- Order a transcript from Parchment to check for errors and remaining credits needed: <https://www.parchment.com/u/registration/9276/account>
- Attend college visits on campus.
- Update your Raise.Me account to keep earning scholarships
- Explore career and college opportunities on www.bigfuture.collegeboard.org
- Attend the NACAC College Fair at Prime Osborne in October as well as other college and career fairs in the area.
- If applicable, register for PSAT at your school (cost – about \$20). Take the PSAT in October.
- Participate in test prep for ACT/SAT.
- If interested in going into the military, make sure you talk to a recruiter and take the Armed Forces Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB).
- Contact your counselor about eligibility for ACT/SAT fee waivers (free and reduced lunch as well as several other criteria).
- Register for ACT and/or SAT for the spring (check current costs on website) www.act.org, and www.collegeboard.org Make sure to use your school code so results come to your school!

11th Grade - SPRING

- Research post-secondary institutions and programs of study to aid in senior year course selection.
- Registration in January through pre-scheduled appointments.
- Order a transcript; check for errors and needed credits.
- Take the SAT and/or ACT – SEND SCORES TO AT LEAST ONE SCHOOL IN FLORIDA for Bright Futures purposes.
- Complete and submit community service hours
- Visit college campuses – set an appointment with the admissions office and notify Ms. Johns to have absence excused.

Summer Before Senior Year

- Complete online courses.
- Visit college campuses.
- Work on community service hours.
- Submit all schedule change requests before school begins. After 21 days a withdraw from any course will be posted on the transcript as a WP or a WF.

BTHS Post-Secondary Readiness Milestones

Senior Year, Semester 1

- Discuss credit check with counselor.
- Complete testing requirements.
- Complete online courses.
- Update resume.
- Request letters of recommendation in person at least 3 weeks in advance.
- Request PDF copy of transcript to check for accuracy.

- Apply to universities and colleges.
- Apply for financial aid.

Senior Year, Semester 2

- Check transcript for accuracy.
- Complete any missing graduation requirements.
- Check your Bright Futures Eligibility; update with accurate institution information.
- Apply to state colleges.
- Apply for scholarships.
- Request a final transcript be sent to your post-secondary institution

Parchment & Ordering Transcripts

- All transcript requests MUST be submitted in Parchment at
<https://www.parchment.com/u/registration/9276/account>
- All transcripts are loaded in Parchment EACH SEMESTER.
- Download a free PDF of the transcript to review.
- Transcripts show the cumulated weighted and unweighted GPA, class rank, letter grades and service hours.

Grade Forgiveness

- Students can retake classes in which they earned a D or F.
- All grades appear on the transcript. Forgiven grades will still show, but will not be included in GPA calculation.
- Juniors should complete grade forgiveness before the beginning of their senior year.
- Options for grade recovery: St. Johns Virtual School and Florida Virtual school (flvs.net) and/or the APEX lab at school during a class period.

SAT and ACT

- Students register online (sat.org and act.org).
- Registration deadlines are usually a month before the test date.

Community Service Hours

- Must be a NON-PROFIT organization.
- Documented on letterhead with the number of hours worked, description, contact signature, parent and student signature.

Submit to Mrs. Richards in the Guidance office.

Financial Aid

- Federal Aid – FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid); www.fafsa.gov ; opens October 1st of senior year
- State of Florida Aid – Bright Futures; www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org ; opens October 1st of senior year
- Institutional Aid – Apply via the college/university you will attend.
- Private Aid – free money from organizations interested in helping students; scholarship opportunities are on the Guidance page of the BTHS website, check your (or your parent's) place of employment; corporations, local businesses, fastweb.com, finaaid.org, collegenet.com, bigfuture.collegeboard.org

Bright Futures

- You must APPLY for Bright Futures by submitting the Florida Financial Aid Application.
- Read over the 2019-20 Bright Futures Student Handbook.
- Know the requirements for the Florida Academic Scholar and the Florida Medallion Scholar.
- Bright Futures GPA is NOT the same as the transcript GPA. Honors, AP and dual enrollment classes are weighed equally with 0.5 per credit (not 1.0 for AP or DE). Two academic electives will be accepted toward the GPA if it benefits the student.
