About the Scholarship Program

- FCCS was established in 1957
- Provides partial scholarships to Florida students attending Cottey College
- Funds are supported by contributions from Florida P.E.O. chapters and individuals. FCCS runs on an annual budget
- Scholarship amounts are based on the interest generated from the fund and its investments
- Scholarships may also be awarded from the Elsie K. Wells Cottey Fund (maintained within the P.E.O. Foundation)

Basis of the Scholarship Awards

- Academic achievement
- Financial needs
- Special talents and skills
- Participation in extracurricular activities
- A letter of intent for educational plans and goals
- Three letters of recommendation
- A letter of recommendation from the sponsoring P.E.O. chapter

Eligibility

- Florida residents who are graduating seniors planning to attend Cottey College
- Continuing Cottey College students who meet scholarship criteria

COTTEY EXPERIENCE

STUDENT BODY: Cottey's residential student capacity of 350 women typically represents 40 states and 20 countries.

ATHLETICS AND STUDENT

ORGANIZATIONS: More than 40 organizations are on campus representing academic areas, cultural and recreational interests, or social, religious, and volunteer activities. Students can also compete in intercollegiate sports as a member of the NAIA.

RESIDENCE HALLS: Three residence halls each house 100 to 150 students who live in apartment-style suites. Each suite accommodates 10 to 12 students and includes single and double bedrooms, a living room, large bathroom, and kitchenette.

SERVICES: The Office of Student Life provides leadership development, counseling services, and access to oncampus health services. The Academic Assistance Center provides resources for career counseling, academic advising, and tutoring, as well as information on volunteering and internships.

EVENTS: Cultural events, performances, lectures, workshops, and recreational activities are offered without additional cost to students. Visit cottey.edu for a complete calendar of events.

ADMISSION & TUITION

ADMISSION: Admission is based on prior performance, academic aptitude, and likelihood of success. Qualified applicants are accepted until August 1 for fall enrollment and December 15 for spring. Apply for admission at cottey.edu/apply.

TUITION: The 2018-2019 academic year total cost of attendance is \$28,850, subject to change yearly.

TYPE: An independent arts and sciences college for women.



FLORIDA COTTEY COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP

APPLICANT GUIDELINES

Thank you for applying for a Florida Cottey College Scholarship to attend Cottey College in Nevada, Missouri. This scholarship is funded by Florida Chapters of the P.E.O. Sisterhood.

The following are requirements for applying:

- 1. The applicant must have a high scholastic standing in her class. (Most applicants are in the top 25% of their high school class and have a B average or better.)
- 2. The applicant must be a resident of the state of Florida.
- 3. The applicant must be accepted for admission to Cottey College. Do not delay sending this application if acceptance is not received by the deadline. Provisional acceptance may possibly be obtained by the chairman in order to consider application.
- 4. The applicant must be sponsored by a Florida P.E.O. Chapter.
- 5. The applicant must send the following items to the Sponsoring Chapter by January 31:
 - The "Florida Cottey College Scholarship Application", "Extracurricular Activities", and "Letter of Intent for Educational Plans and Goals" typed documents.
 - A copy of current high school transcripts.
 - A copy of test scores SAT/ACT.
 - Three Letters of Recommendation: guidance counselor, high school principal, teacher, clergy, business/professional person, etc.
 - Family Financial Statement.
 - A recent color photograph attached to the application.

The amount of the scholarship will be based on qualifications and available funds. Students are strongly urged to apply to Cottey College for additional financial aid as soon as possible if the applicant has need (by January 1).

The sponsoring chapter submits the complete application package to the state chairman of the Florida Cottey College Scholarship Committee on or before March 1. A late application package may be considered at the discretion of the committee (and funds permitting).

RENEWALS: The scholarship may be renewed if the applicant meets the following requirements:

- □Minimum grade point average of 2.0, as evidenced by Cottey College transcript.
- The applicant must notify the sponsoring chapter by **December 31** of their intent to return to Cottey. (The sponsoring chapter will then request a renewal of the scholarship in writing to the chairman of the FCCS Committee by **January 31**).
- □ Applicant must complete and sign the **Form for Renewal of a P.E.O. Scholarship** and send it to the Registrar and Dean of Student Life for completion. Renewal of scholarship is contingent upon the return of this form.
- ☐ The applicant *must* pay the required deposit to Cottey College.
