- Financial aid is ANY Resource that can help you pay for college.
 - Grants (you don't have to pay back)
 - Scholarships (you don't have to pay back)
 - Work-Study (you don't have to pay back)
 - Loans (you DO have to pay back)
- You can use financial aid to help pay for:
 - Tuition
 - Books
 - Room & Board
 - Supplies
 - Transportation

FOUR WAYS TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID

SCHOLARSHIP TIPS

HELPFUL TIPS

- Start searching for scholarships early and continue searching throughout college.
- Apply to EVERY scholarship for which you are eligible.
- Essays can be reused and tailored for each new application.
- Review your social media accounts and remove inappropriate material.
- Make sure you have an appropriate e-mail address.

GET ORGANIZED

- Make a list of deadlines and don't miss them.
- Keep a folder/file/binder with everything that is needed to apply for multiple scholarships.
 - ACT/SAT/PERT scores
 - High school transcript (request one from Parchment)
 - Letters of recommendation (because you may be able to use one for multiple scholarships)
 - Resume of activities, community service, and leadership roles
 - Essays (because you may be able to use one essay for multiple scholarships)
- Get an appropriate e-mail address

- Don't give out bank account, credit card, or social security information.

You must apply for the scholarship by submitting a completed Florida Financial Aid Application during senior year



Your goal should be to have all of your community service completed by the end of junior year



Bright Futures GPA is NOT the same as BTHS GPA



Bright Futures weighs honors, AP, and dual enrollment classes equally with 0.5 per credit earned – NOT 1.0 weight for AP or DE!



Bright Futures will also accept two additional academic electives toward the GPA calculation if it benefits the student.

LET'S GET STARTED

- Log into your HAC account to view report card grades/transcripts
- Go to <https://www.raise.me/join/bartram-trail-high-school>
- Enter your email address & a password you will remember
- Fill out basic details like your name, address, birthday, gender, and where you heard about Raise.me
- This information will be part of your student profile, so double check to make sure it's all accurate
- You receive report cards quarterly
- Update your graduation year
- Choose all of the colleges you're interested in (and more)

LET'S START EARNING MONEY FOR COLLEGE!

- Be sure to be honest and accurate as colleges will reference this information in the future
- Add achievements – sports, activity, community service hours, awards, a college visit (event), grades
- All achievements are saved to your portfolio on Raise.Me
- Keep adding achievements to your portfolio throughout high school
- The stronger your portfolio is, the more opportunities you'll have to earn money from colleges you are following.
