There are many ways students can pay for their post-secondary education. Scholarships, unlike student loans, don't have to be paid back and there are millions of scholarships available!





When should students begin applying for Scholarships?

MYTH or FACT ?

Only high school seniors apply for scholarships, and typically during fall semester.





Students do not need to wait until they are a senior in high school to start searching for scholarships. It actually pays to start earlier!

Not only are scholarships available to freshman, sophomores, juniors and seniors – both in high school AND college, but scholarships can also be found year-round!



All scholarships have their application deadlines at certain points in the year, but not all of those occur in the fall or spring months.

There are many scholarships that have deadlines in the summer. Summer is a great time to go scholarship hunting when students do not have the additional burden of homework or studying for tests.





How should students begin the process of applying for Scholarships?

The first step is to **GET ORGANIZED**!





Start by gathering important documents such as:

- ACT/SAT/PERT test scores
- Unofficial high school transcript
- Letters of recommendation
- Create a resume of activities, community service, leadership roles, & skills
- **Essays** (you may be able to use one essay for multiple scholarships)
- Keep all of these materials together in a binder



Here are some more Scholarship tips:

- Create a dedicated scholarship email account with an appropriate email address (FirstName.LastName@gmail.com)
- Review social media accounts and remove inappropriate material
- Get a calendar specifically to write down scholarship deadlines and do not miss them
- When writing essays, make sure you follow all directions exactly, stick to the prompt, use the accurate work count, and try approaching the topic in a creative way.
- Set a goal of applying to one scholarship a week.



Where can you find Scholarships?

Many post-secondary schools offer scholarships. Check with the university, college, or trade school's website for requirements and deadlines. Almost all of these have a scholarship page. Also check the webpage of the department of your intended major. Most of these opportunities are first come, first served.





Other places to look for Scholarships include:

- National, State and Local Organizations


