Earning College Credit in High School

Advanced Placement

- Courses at Bartram Trail HS
- Over 25 AP Courses offered at BTHS and most subjects covered, including electives
- 1.0 value added per credit
- Take AP Test in May; Scores range 1-5
- Generally get AP credit for score of 3 or above
- It does not count towards your College GPA

Dual Enrollment

- Most courses at SJRSC
- Three campuses
- Many courses are offered
- 1.0 value added per credit
- ACT/SAT/CPT/PERT score required
- 3.0 unweighted GPA required
- SJR State Application each semester
- Courses go on your college transcript permanently

Earning College Credit in High School

Requirements for taking Advanced Placement & Honors Courses

- ACT/SAT/PERT/CPT scores are NOT required
- No minimum GPA required
- AP courses DO require minimum FSA-10 Reading scores and/or Math scores (level 4 or 5 and no less than 3 in any area)
- AP courses require prior success of a "C" or higher in academic courses at honors or AP level
- Students earning a grade of "A" in a previous standard course in the subject area may be recommended for Honors or AP

Earning College Credit in High School

Requirements **REQUESTING** to drop AP & Honors Courses

Students may NOT drop a course due to difficulty or teacher preference.

Students cannot drop an AP or Honors course unless:

- 1) The student has earned a 'D' or 'F' for the semester***
- 2) The student seeking consistent academic assistance from their teacher and***
- 3) There has been a parent conference with teacher***

Registration for SAT/ACT – online; send scores to a Florida school!

- **Earn good grades! Work on Grade Forgiveness (FLVS or APEX)**
- **Monitor your grades in Home Access Center (HAC)**
- **Earn Community Service Hours for Bright Futures!**

Semester Two Important Tasks

- **Register for ACT** at www.actstudent.org and **SAT** at www.sat.org
Both tests are offered here at BTHS
Choose to send scores to colleges when registering
Most colleges and universities require one or the other
- **Practice Testing** - Utilize the practice tests on each web site
- **Request** your transcript via Parchment the end of February and make sure everything is correct.
- **Register for Senior Year Courses** - via English courses
- **Register for St. Johns River Dual Enrollment** – May
- **Research Colleges and Attend College Visits**
- **Finish Strong with Good Grades**
- **Earn Community Service Hours for Bright Futures!**

Tracking and Recovery

Monitor your grades in Home Access Center (HAC)
Best practice is once a week!

Semester 1 ENDS → ***January 25***



- Don't wait until the quarter is close to ending to seek help. Attending help sessions and parent conferences should happen well before then!
- Review **Schoology** sites for times of assistance outside of the classroom

Grade Forgiveness

- Students can retake classes in which they earned a “D” or “F” to earn grade forgiveness.
- Grades cannot be erased from a transcript - all grades will appear on the transcript, BUT the grade that is forgiven will not be included in the GPA calculation.
- Juniors should complete grade forgiveness now, before the beginning of their senior year.

Florida Financial Aid Bright Futures Scholarship Program

- The Bright Futures application is completed during a student's senior year.
- Seniors complete the Florida Financial Aid Application which opens October 1st of a student's senior year.
- The two academic scholarships awards are:
Florida Academic Scholar (FAS) and **Florida Medallion Scholar** (FMS)
- There is also a Gold Seal Vocational Scholarship
- World language **is required** for Bright Futures and seniors must complete two sequential years of the same language

Bright Futures

- Bright Futures GPA weighting is 0.5 Weight for Honors, AP, and Dual Enrollment courses.
- Bright Futures does not use your BTHS GPA; they calculate their own GPA.
- Scholarship can be used in only **Florida** (approved) schools
- Scholarship must be initiated within **five years** post high school graduation
