General Master Schedule Process

- 1. Teachers have already made core course and upper-level elective recommendations
- 2. Students choose the rest of their 7 courses in HAC –DEADLINE is January 28th
- 3. Students have until last day of school to use online forms to make changes to requests
- 4. March July: BT is creating the master schedule based on your choices
- 5. The week of July 18th there will be a Schedule Preview in HAC, so you can see your schedule before school starts.
 - 1. Remember we won't do schedule changes at this time, only corrections

Registration Timeline

- HAC is open for students to see teacher recommendations and make elective decisions
 - No 1:1 meetings with School Counselors so students have to do this
 - 2. Elective choices due in HAC by 1/28/22
 - 3. Students need to make sure they have a total of 7 courses listed
- 2. January 27th and 28th School Counselors will be meeting with rising 11th graders through English classes to walk them through how to choose electives in HAC and to go over FAQ's
- Still have questions,
 - 1. Have your student stop by their School Counselor's office during lunch
 - Sign up for a 10 minute time slot to talk with your student's school counselor

Recommendations vs Requests

- Current teachers make recommendations for next year's core courses and upper-level electives.
 - Feel free to take a look at our Course Progressions on our Registration webpage to see our recommended core course sequence.
- Requests are what you get to pick in HAC to complete your list of 7 total courses for next year.

Request Changes vs Schedule Changes

- We don't do schedule changes, so make sure your recommendations and requests are correct!
 - Use the forms on our Registration
 Webpage to request:
 - Core re-evaluations deadline
 June 2nd
 - Academy drops deadline
 February 10th
 - Virtual courses (deadline to replace a BTHS course with the virtual version is July 15th)
 - To change an elective January 28th June 2nd

Graduation Requirements

24 credits must be earned in all the following:

- English 1, 2, 3, and 4
- Algebra, Geometry, and two additional math courses
- Biology and two additional sciences
- World History, US History, Government, and Economics
- Practical/performing/fine arts
- HOPE*
- 8 elective credits
 - If you're planning to attend college, you will need two credits in the SAME world language

2.0 unweighted, cumulative GPA

Must pass two assessments – Algebra 1 EOC and 10th grade FSA-ELA

One full length online course (*HOPE counts for this at BTHS)

Your Junior/Senior schedule should set you up for your first year out of high school


Going to a 4 year college or university? Take classes that will prepare you for your major. Take more classes beyond the minimum required for graduation 02

All science courses after Biology should be chosen based on a student's future career. Choose a course that sounds interesting to you and will prepare you for your postsecondary plans.




- All math courses after Algebra 2 should be chosen based on a student's future career. Choose a course that sounds interesting to you and will prepare you for your postsecondary plans.





Help from School Counselors During English Class



During an Individual Appointment, School Counselors Cannot ...

- Change English, Math, Science, or History Classes must be requested via "Core Recommendation Re-Evaluation Form"
- Add Electives must be added via HAC by 1/28/22
- Change Locked Electives –must be requested via "Non-Academy Elective Replacement Form)
- Drop Academy Elective must be requested via "Academy Drop Form"

School Counselors can ...

- Answer questions regarding classes to choose based on post-secondary plans
- Answer questions regarding FCTC & SJRSC Dual Enrollment

Academy Information

- If currently in an academy, no need to reapply
- Only current 8th and 9th grade students are eligible to apply for academies in SJCSD
- Drop form must be turned in by February 10 to drop an academy class from the schedule: https://www-bths.stjohns.k12.fl.us/academies/wp-content/uploads/sites/3/2021/11/Drop-Form-SY22-23pdf-BTHS-E001933-L3.pdf
- If student drops an academy class and Bartram is NOT your zoned school, you will return to your home zone school.

ACT & SAT Information

VERY IMPORTANT - Students will be evaluated for Bright Futures based on official test scores from the FDOE repository. To ensure Office of Student Financial Assistance obtains official test scores: Ensure demographics on your test registration and high school transcript match; and request your official test scores be sent to one of Florida's 12 state universities when registering for the ACT and/or SAT.

ACT/SAT/PSAT/AP Test Accommodations

- If your child has a disability that affects how they test, accommodations are available (IEP or 504 plan).
- These accommodations are approved through College Board for AP, SAT, and PSAT and though ACT for ACT tests.
- Please keep in mind that school counselors need the consent at least 2-3 months prior to the College Board and ACT test date.

- What is it? Traditional Dual enrollment is a Florida educational program that enables high school students to take a college course and be awarded both college credits and the high school credit for the single course.
- What do you need?
- 3.0 unweighted, cumulative GPA and
- College Ready Math, Reading, and Writing Scores
 - ACT Reading 19 or SAT Reading 24 or CPT Reading 83 or PERT Reading 106
 - ACT English 17 or SAT Writing and Language 25 or CPT Sentence Skills 83 or PERT English –
 103
 - ACT Math 21 or SAT Math 25 or CPT Elementary Algebra 85 or PERT Math 123

Dual Enrollment Requirements for SJRSC

How to Register for Dual Enrollment at SJRSC

- Meet the qualifications (3.0 GPA and test scores).
- Turn in the following each term (summer, fall, and spring) the student is registering for dual enrollment by the published deadline:
 - ACT or SAT or PERT qualifying test scores
 - Complete online SJRSC DUAL ENROLLMENT application
 - Consent Form
 - Registration/Approval Form
- Maximum number of courses:
 - Summer Term = 8 credit hours (max 2 courses)
 - Fall Term = 10 credit hours
 - Spring Term = 10 credit hours

Can I take dual enrollment courses on Bartram's campus next year?

No, dual enrollment on Bartram's campus will not be offered next school year.

Dual Enrollment – Things to Keep in Mind

- Do parents have access to student's dual enrollment course grades? Can they correspond with students' college professors?
 - No. Students are expected to handle all communication because they are considered a college student. No one at SJRSC, including students' professors, can communicate with parents per FERPA.
- What if students have accommodations?
 - The student will need to work with the SJRSC Disabilities Services office to determine what accommodations, if any, can be used in college classes

Dual Enrollment – Things to Keep in Mind

- Are dual enrollment courses 'watered down' to fit the needs of high school students?
 - No. These courses are adult level courses and students should have not only the academic maturity, but the social/emotional maturity to handle adult content matter and academic responsibilities.
- What is the impact of dual enrollment?
 - Dual enrollment is the start of a college transcript. Dual enrollment grades will
 follow students forever, which can impact admittance to college/university,
 acceptance into the students major, and enrollment in graduate school. Doing
 poorly in dual enrollment courses may also negatively impact financial aid.


Good attendance and discipline record

2.0 unweighted GPA for dual enrollment only

On track for graduation

Room in the students schedule for a minimum of two consecutive periods and travel time to FCTC. Also please be advised some courses may require additional periods.

How can I get a reduced schedule or take CO-OP?

- Reduced* 11th graders can reduce 1 period if they are taking 4 or more AP, and/or DE courses
 - Choices for reduced schedule: 1st
 only or 7th only
 - This is just a request; it is not a guarantee that students will get their requested modified period
- CO-OP Students can take 1 CO-OP during 7th period (listed as Executive Internship or CO-OP) during 11th grade. Students must work 5 hours a week for every CO-OP course, turn paystub into Ms. Richards, and do one assignment a quarter. Students earn a credit for CO-OP.

^{*}Students still need 8 elective credits for graduation, so choose wisely when requesting a reduced schedule



Students can retake classes in which they earn a D or F (if the class is offered on FLVS, SJVS, or APEX Credit Recovery)



All grades appear on the official transcript.
Forgiven grades will still show on transcript but will not be included in GPA calculation



All grade forgiveness should be completed before senior year




Options for grade recovery: St Johns Virtual School, Florida Virtual School, and/or APEX credit recovery*

*Courses taken via APEX credit recovery will not count towards NCAA eligibility

Grade Forgiveness

What about parking?

- Parking and scheduling have NOTHING to do with each other.
- If you choose modified, CO-OP, or off campus dual enrollment and DO NOT get a spot, then parents will have to pick you up/drop you off or you will need to use the form to change elective choices after parking information goes out.

What happens if student scores a level 1 or 2 on the FSA ELA this year?

■ They will be placed in a reading course for the 22-23 SY and you won't be on track to graduate with a standard high school diploma (remember, passing the 10th grade FSA ELA or earning a concordant from ACT or SAT is a graduation requirement).

Community Service

- Not needed for graduation
- Needed for \$\$ (scholarships, including Bright Futures)
- Documented by a verification letter that is on letterhead
- Community service verification letters and volunteer service plan form can be turned into Ms. Richards in the school counseling area of the main building
