Graduation GPA Requirement

Grade Toint Average Cumulative GPA must be a minimum of 2.0 on an unweighted 4.0 scale

<u>Course Concerns</u> should be addressed during the first quarter, BEFORE a poor grade impacts a student's semester grade/credit/GPA. Course Attendance, Completion of Assignments, Preparation for Testing and Seeking Additional Help from the Teacher are the foundation of success in all courses.

<u>Highly at Risk</u> - D/F Grades in multiple courses may need intervention. The first review by a team of educators will be a look at the student's ATTENDANCE, COMPLETION of ASSIGNMENTS, TEST SCORES, and ADDITIONAL ASSISTANCE received. An "All Teacher" conference may be appropriate.

Parents can set an appointment directly with an individual teacher to talk about their student's performance in a course.

For students highly at risk, a school counselor can coordinate an All Teacher Conference at the parent's request.

Graduation Testing Requirements

Required Assessments Students Must Take: Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology 1, US History*

*Students taking AP US History or DE US History are not required to complete the EOC for a standard high school diploma.

Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST)

Administered for the first time in the 2022-23 school year. Students who entered grade 9 in 2021-22 must earn a passing grade 10 ELA Reading score in the third progress monitoring window (PM3) to meet this graduation requirement.

TESTING ACCOMMODATIONS

There are also specific deadlines for these request strictly followed by College Board and ACT.

Print and complete the form(s) and have your student turn it in to their school counselor well before the 'request for accommodations' deadline.

Students who are approved for accommodations by College Board and/or ACT for a specific test date do not need to re-request accommodations for any future test(s).
