# **Grade Forgiveness**

- Students can retake classes in which they earned a "D" or "F" to earn grade forgiveness.
- Grades cannot be erased from a transcript all grades will appear on the transcript, BUT the grade that is forgiven will not be included in the GPA calculation.
- Juniors should complete grade forgiveness now, before the beginning of their senior year.

# Earning College Credit in High School

Requirements for REQUESTING to drop

AP & Honors Courses

Counselors do not have the ability to change schedules!

Students may NOT drop a course due to difficulty OR for teacher preference.

# Students cannot drop a course unless:

- 1) The student has earned a 'D' or 'F' for the semester
- 2) The student seeking consistent academic assistance from their teacher and
- 3) There has been a parent conference with teacher

# Earning College Credit in High School

### **Advanced Placement**

- Courses at Bartram Trail HS
- Over 25 AP Courses offered at BTHS, and most subjects covered, including electives
- 1.0 value added per credit
- Take AP Test in May; Scores range 1-5
- Generally get AP credit for score of 3 or above
- It does <u>not</u> count towards your College GPA

### **Dual Enrollment**

- Most courses at SJRSC
- Three campuses: St. Aug, OP & Palatka
- Many courses are offered
- 1.0 value added per credit
- ACT/SAT/CPT/PERT score required
- 3.0 unweighted GPA required
- SJR State Application <u>each semester</u>
- Courses go on your college transcript permanently

# Florida Financial Aid Bright Futures Scholarship Program

- The Bright Futures application is completed during a student's senior year.
- Seniors complete the Florida Financial Aid Application which opens October 1st of a student's senior year.
- The two academic scholarships awards are:
  Florida Academic Scholar (FAS) and Florida Medallion Scholar (FMS)
- There is also a Gold Seal Vocational Scholarship
- World language is required for Bright Futures and seniors must complete two sequential years of the same language

# **Bright Futures**

- Bright Futures GPA weighting is 0.5 Weight for Honors, AP, and Dual Enrollment courses.
- Bright Futures does not use your BTHS GPA; they calculate their own GPA.
- Scholarship can be used only at Florida (approved) schools
- Scholarship must be initiated within five years post high school graduation

# **Community Service and Work Hours**

- Students should be engaged in meaningful activities inside and outside of school. While service hours are not a graduation requirement, they are important for Bright Futures and for college applications.
- Community service hours must be documented on letterhead, signed by the supervisor, a parent and the student, and then submitted to Ms. Richards, the guidance secretary.
- Work hours are now accepted for Bright Futures eligibility -- submit paystubs that total 100 paid work hours and a reflection log.
- A Volunteer Service Plan/Reflection log is required to be turned in with your letter or your paystubs. This form is on the School Counseling website.
- Community Service hours and work hours MAY NOT be combined to reach a total of 100 hours.




