

CO-OP

To Modify or not to Modify

Take Academic electives

MODIFIED

Seniors can Modify up to 3 periods if they are on track for high school graduation.

- Student should provide their own transportation.
- Morning or afternoon modified periods cannot be quaranteed.

VPS -VOLUNTEER PUBLIC SERVICE (INTERN)

Seniors can be a Teacher or Office Intern and earn 75 service hours for the year.

Seniors can have up

- Students are making a full-year commitment.
- These hours qualify for community service.

to 3 CO-OP periods and will be allowed to leave campus early.

- Students should provide their own transportation
- Students should work 5 hours per week for each period of CO-OP on their schedule.
- Assignments and pay stubs will be turned in to earn a grade in this elective course which will affect GPA.
- Work hours above CO-OP qualify for community service.

CO-OP

A STUDENT'S SENIOR SCHEDULE SHOULD SET THEM UP FOR THEIR FIRST YEAR OUT OF HIGH SCHOOL

4 Year College or University

Going to a 4-year college or university? Take classes that will prepare them for their major. Take more classes beyond the minimum required for graduation.

Vocational

Going to a vocational school? Take classes at FCTC (First Coast Technical College) through dual enrollment to get a jump start on their education for free.

2 Year State College

Going to SJRSC or another state college? Take classes that will prepare them for their major. Possibly through dual enrollment. Tuition is less expensive!

Earning College Credit in High School

Advanced Placement

- Courses at Bartram Trail HS
- Over 25 AP Courses offered at BTHS, and most subjects covered, including electives
- 1.0 value added per credit
- Take AP Test in May; Scores range 1-5
- Generally, get AP credit for score of 3 or above
- It does <u>not</u> count towards your College GPA

Dual Enrollment

- Courses are at SJRSC, or online at home (must have transportation)
- Three campuses: St. Augustine, OP & Palatka
- 1.0 value added per credit
- ACT/SAT/CPT/PERT score required
- 3.0 unweighted GPA required
- SJR State Application <u>each semester</u>
- Students may take a maximum of 10 DE credits in the fall/spring and 6 to 8 DE credits in the summer
- Courses permanently go on college transcript

WITH ALL OF THESE THINGS IN MIND, HERE ARE SOME EXAMPLES OF TYPICAL SENIOR SCHEDULES.



HOW CAN YOUR STUDENT PREPARE FOR THEIR **UPCOMING** REGISTRATION APPOINTMENT?



Rising seniors should consider their post-secondary plans, career interests, scholarship and Bright Futures requirements, NCAA requirements, etc. Please have your rising senior read the handout provided.

Registration

- ❖ Students will be come to their registration appointment through their English classes and sit with their school counselor to choose courses and confirm selections.
- * Again, please have your student refer to the handout provided.
- Please have the discussion with your student about their commitment to courses they choose for their senior year.
- * The last day to request course changes is the last day of school (May 25th).
- Schedules cannot be changed after school starts, even if the course is not a graduation requirement.

Junior Year

- Registration in February through English classes.
- Order a transcript through Parchment at https://www.parchment.com/u/registration/9276/account; check for errors and needed credits.
- Take the SAT and/or ACT
- Complete and submit community service hours

Parchment & Ordering Transcripts

- All transcripts are loaded in Parchment EACH SEMESTER.
- Request a free PDF of the transcript to review.
- Transcripts show the cumulative weighted and unweighted GPA, class rank, letter grades and service hours.

Grade Forgiveness

- Students can retake classes in which they earned a D or F.
- All grades appear on the transcript. Forgiven grades will still show, but will not be included in GPA calculation.
- Juniors should complete grade forgiveness NOW, before the beginning of their senior year.
- Options for grade recovery: St. Johns Virtual School and Florida Virtual school (flvs.net) and/or the APEX lab at school during a class period. APEX is not an improved option for NCAA.

State Assessment Requirements

Students must pass the following statewide assessments:

- Grade 10 English Language Arts (ELA) or a concordant score.
- Algebra 1 end-of-course (EOC) or a concordant score.
- A concordant is an approved/pre-determined score on specific tests identified by the state (SAT, ACT, PSAT, & Geometry EOC).

SAT and ACT

- Students register online (sat.org and act.org).
- Registration deadlines are usually a month before the test date.

Community Service Hours

- Must be a NON-PROFIT organization.
- Documented on letterhead with the number of hours worked, description, contact signature, parent and student signature.
- Submit to Mrs. Richards in the Guidance office.

Summer

- Complete online courses.
- Visit college campuses.
- Work on community service hours.
- Submit all schedule change requests before the last day of school (link). After 21 days a withdraw from any course will be posted on the transcript as a WP or a WF.

Senior Year, Semester 1

- Discuss credit check with counselor.
- Complete testing requirements.
- Complete online courses.
- Request transcript to check for accuracy.
- Apply to universities and colleges.
- Apply for financial aid.

Financial Aid

- Federal Aid FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid); www.fafsa.gov; opens October 1st
- State Florida Aid Bright Futures; www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org; opens October 1st
- Institutional Aid Apply via the college/university you will attend.
- Private Aid free money from organizations interested in helping students; scholarship opportunities are on the Guidance page of the BTHS website, check your (or your parent's) place of employment; corporations, local businesses, special interest groups, national, state and local organizations, fastweb.com, finaid.org, collegenet.com, bigfuture.collegeboard.org

Bright Futures

- You must APPLY for Bright Futures by submitting the Florida Financial Aid Application.
- Applications open October 1st.
- Students will have the opportunity to complete the application in school.
- Read over the Bright Futures Student Handbook.
- Know the requirements for the Florida Academic Scholar and the Florida Medallion Scholar.
- Bright Futures GPA is NOT the same as the transcript GPA. Honors, AP and Dual Enrollment classes are weighed equally with 0.5 per credit (not 1.0 for AP or DE). Two academic electives will be accepted toward the GPA if it benefits the student.

Senior Year, Semester 2

- Check transcript for accuracy.
- Complete any missing graduation requirements.
- Online courses must be completed no later than May 1st.
- Check your Bright Futures Eligibility, update with accurate institution information.
- Apply to state colleges.
- Apply for scholarships.
- Request a final transcript be sent to your post-secondary institution.

ACT & SAT INFORMATION

VERY IMPORTANT

Students will be evaluated for Bright Futures based on official test scores from the FDOE repository. To ensure Bright Futures obtains official test scores:

- Ensure demographics on your test registration and high school transcript match
- Request your official test scores be sent to one of Florida's 12 state universities when registering for the ACT and/or SAT.

HOW TO TURN IN COMMUNITY SERVICE/PAID WORK HOURS

Have the supervisor of vour service provide a signed letter on the organization's letterhead describing the type of service performed, who in the community the service benefited, and a description of the service event. Student and parent/quardian should sign this letter.

For paid work, student will need to print a copy of their pay stub.

Student should fill out the reflection log, located on the district website and at Ms. Richards desk.

BRIGHT FUTURES

- Seniors apply for BF after October 1st of their senior year. Senior school counselors will be providing Financial Aid lessons and give seniors the opportunity to complete their online application.
- Students should be keeping up with course work and maintain a high GPA especially in CORE classes (English, Math, Science, Social Studies, World Language).
- Students should stay involved in school and their community.
- Students should turn in service hours/work hours to Ms. Richards on a regular basis.
- Students should take the ACT and/or SAT and send scores to Florida Universities.
