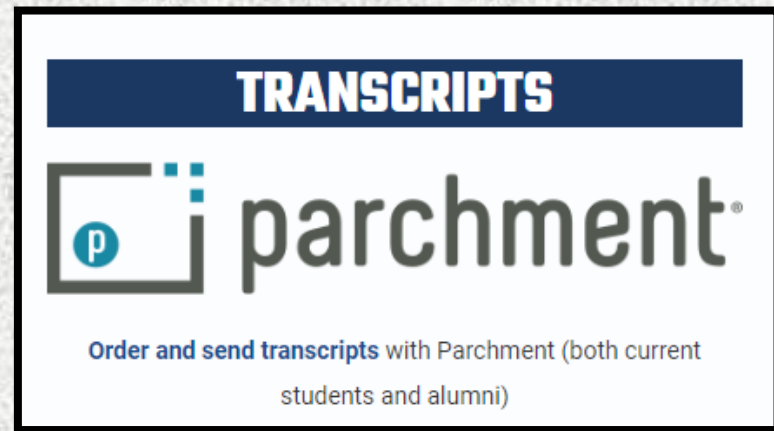
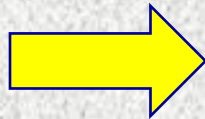

Grade Forgiveness

- Students can retake classes in which they earned a “D” or “F” to earn grade forgiveness.
- Grades cannot be taken off a transcript, BUT the grade that is forgiven will not be included in the GPA calculation. The new grade will be calculated.
- Juniors should complete grade forgiveness **now**, before the beginning of their senior year.

- * St. Johns Virtual School or Florida Virtual School
- * Edmentum – Credit Recovery program completed at home, or next year in the Edmentum Lab at school or at home
(NCAA Student-Athletes cannot use Edmentum)

Dropping a Course

Counselors do not have the ability to change schedules!

The last day to request a change in your courses was the last day of school LAST YEAR!

Students may NOT drop a course due to difficulty OR for teacher preference.

District Policy is Students cannot drop a course unless:

- 1) The student has earned a 'D' or 'F' for the semester*
- 2) The student seeking consistent academic assistance from their teacher and*
- 3) There has been a parent conference with teacher*

Earning College Credit in High School

Advanced Placement

- Courses at Bartram Trail HS
- Over 25 AP Courses offered at BTHS, and most subjects covered, including electives
- 1.0 value added per credit
- Take AP Test in May; Scores range 1-5
- Generally, get AP credit for score of 3 or above
- It does **not** count towards your College GPA

Dual Enrollment

- Most courses at SJRSC
- Three campuses: St. Aug, OP & Palatka
- Many courses are offered
- 1.0 value added per credit
- ACT/SAT/CPT/PERT score required
- 3.0 unweighted GPA required
- SJR State Application each semester
- Courses go on your college transcript permanently

Earning College Credit in High School

Requirements for taking Dual Enrollment Courses

- ACT, SAT, PERT or PSAT scores are required
- Most dual enrollment courses require a minimum score

For English (ENC 1101):

19 ACT Reading and 17 English **or**
24 SAT Reading and 25 Writing/Lang **or**
106 PERT Reading and 103 Writing **or**
24-28 PSAT/NMSQT or PSAT 10 Reading
and 18-35 Writing

For College Algebra (MAC1105):

21 ACT Math **OR**
25 SAT Math **OR**
123 PERT Math **OR**
26.5-38 PSAT/NMSQT or PSAT10 Math

- **3.0 unweighted GPA required**
- **Complete an accurate SJR State application** completed and turned in by the published deadlines – **May** for the next Fall semester, **October** for the following Spring semester.

Earning College Credit in High School

Requirements for taking Advanced Placement & Honors Courses

- ACT/SAT/PERT/CPT scores are NOT required
- No minimum GPA required
- AP courses DO require minimum FSA/FAST scores and/or BEST Algebra scores (level 4 or 5 and no less than 3 in any area)
- AP courses require prior success of a "C" or higher in academic courses at honors or AP level
- Students earning a grade of "A" in a previous standard course in the subject area may be recommended for Honors or AP

Post-Secondary Options

Credential or Certificate

Community/State College – FSCJ, SJRSC, J-Tech

Examples of careers: automotive, welding, HVAC, cosmetology, EMS, fire fighting

State College (Two-Year, Associate Degree) – SJRCS, FSCJ, TCC, Valencia, Santa Fe

AS Degree – Two-year degree then straight into the workforce ◦ Examples of careers: nursing, air traffic controller, dental hygienist, radiological tech, IT

AA Degree – Two-year degree that transfers to a four-year college/university to earn Bachelor's Degree

Four Year College or University (Four-Year, Bachelor's Degree)

Master's Degree - Can be obtained after Bachelor's Degree

Doctorate Degree - Can be obtained after Master's Degree

Military – ASVAB test; talk with Recruiters

How do you pay for Education after High School

There are FOUR ways to get Financial Aid!

Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Florida Financial Aid (Bright Futures, etc.)

Institutional Financial Aid (Colleges)

Private Scholarships

Florida Financial Aid Bright Futures Scholarship Program

- The Bright Futures application is completed during a student's senior year, which opens on October 1st.
- There are two academic scholarships:
 - Florida Academic Scholar (FAS)** – 100% Tuition
 - Florida Medallion Scholar (FMS)** – 75% Tuition
- There is also a **Gold Seal Vocational Scholarship** for students enrolling in a career education or certificate program (Technical program).

Bright Futures – Academic and Medallion Scholarships

- World language **is required** for Bright Futures and seniors must complete two sequential years of the same language
- Bright Futures GPA weighting is 0.5 Weight for Honors, AP, and Dual Enrollment courses.
- Bright Futures does not use your BTHS GPA; they calculate their own GPA using 16 core courses and 2 World Language.
- Bright Futures can be used only at **Florida** (approved) schools
- Scholarship must be initiated within **five years** post high school graduation.

- * You must send your test scores to a Florida Public University.
- * Test Prep will help improve your SAT/ACT scores.

Community Service and Work Hours

- Students should be engaged in meaningful activities inside and outside of school. While service hours are not a graduation requirement, they are important for Bright Futures and for college applications.
- Community service hours must be documented on letterhead, signed by the supervisor, a parent and the student, and then submitted to Ms. Richards, the guidance secretary with a Volunteer Service Plan or 'Reflection Log' Reflection Log attached.
- Paid work hours are submitted by paystubs that total 100 paid work hours and a Reflection Log attached (just the top section).
