Bartram Trail High School serves as a center for academic excellence, community involvement and character development, while fostering a joy for lifelong learning.

Established in 2000, Bartram Trail High School (BTHS) is a public high school located in northwest St. Johns County, Florida. As a member of the St. Johns County School District, BTHS is a high-performance school consistently recognized by the State of Florida for academic excellence and by *Newsweek* and *The Washington Post* as one of the best schools in the nation. BTHS offers students the VyStar Academy of Business & Finance and the Design Academy. The Design Academy features Architecture, Interior Design, and Fashion Design. BTHS offers Advanced Placement courses, Air Force ROTC, and Dual Enrollment.

Established in 1821, St. Johns County is primarily a residential area best known for its county seat of St. Augustine. The county's economic industry is tourism. Visitors and residents frequent the historical landmarks, beaches, parks, and golf courses sprinkled alongside the many miles of accessible waterways offered by the St. Johns River and the Atlantic Ocean. Higher education is readily available to residents through private and state colleges located in the county and through the University of North Florida located in Jacksonville, FL. St. Johns County is part of the Jacksonville Metropolitan Statistical Area that also includes Duval, Clay, Nassau, and Baker counties. The residents of this Metropolitan area are influenced by endeavors of the Arts, Agriculture, History, Recreation, Business & Industry, and suburban, rural, and city life. Student enrollment at BTHS is 2,120 students for the 2025-2026 school year.

CURRICULUM AND REQUIREMENTS

Each BTHS student has the opportunity to take seven courses each year on a traditional schedule of seven, 45-minute periods each day. Students may complete additional coursework for credit through Florida Virtual School or St Johns Virtual School. BTHS requires students to meet the State of Florida credit, grade point average, and testing requirements to earn a standard high school diploma. Honors Courses

BTHS offers 61 honors courses. Students earn a value point of .5 per credit earned in their weighted grade point average for each honors course passed. The following honors courses are available:

College Board Advanced Placement (AP)

BTHS offers 27 AP Courses. AP courses receive an additional value point of 1 added to the weighted grade point average for each credit earned.
