Exploring Options


Early planning allows exploration of various career paths and educational opportunities.

ACADEMIC PATHWAYS



State Universities

State universities offer four-year degree programs with diverse academic options and research opportunities.

State Colleges

State colleges provide two-year associate degrees, four-year bachelor degrees, pathways to transfer to four-year universities, and technical and career certifications.

Technical Colleges

Technical colleges emphasize vocational training and certifications preparing students for specific careers.

Private Institutions

Private colleges often offer specialized programs tailored to niche academic and career goals.



Career and Technical Education

CTE programs provide hands-on training in healthcare, IT, and automotive services to prepare students for careers.

Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships blend classroom instruction with on-the-job experience, offering practical employment routes.

Certifications and Workforce Entry

Certifications validate skills and enhance job prospects for direct entry into the workforce.

Parental Support

Parents can encourage career exploration and support students' interests to help guide career decisions.






Parents help by organizing documents, reviewing essays, and encouraging meaningful student activities.





Schedule a Visit


Students and parents should visit any prospective colleges (including career & technical schools). If the student is in good standing with their attendance, these will be excused absences with evidence of your visit.
