What is Financial Aid?

Financial aid is **ANY** Resource that can help you pay for college.

- Grants you do not have to pay back
- Scholarships you do not have to pay back
- Work-Study you do not have to pay back
- Loans you DO have to pay back

You can use financial aid to help pay for:

- Tuition
- Room & Board
- Books
- Supplies
- Transportation

Federal Aid

FAFSA stands for Free Application for Federal Student Aid

EVERYONE – regardless of your parents' income; many colleges require a FAFSA to be on file to receive a Scholarship.
October 1 st of your senior year AND every year after that while enrolled in college; remember this money is FIRST COME FIRST SERVED
Grants, Federal Guaranteed Student Loans, and Work-Study provided by the Federal Government
Tax forms/records, W-2 forms, social security number, driver's license and FSA ID

- This money is NOT first come first served!

• 14 different Grants and Scholarships provided by the State Government, including Bright Futures.

What if I plan to attend college out of state?

- If you apply and qualify during your Senior year, the scholarship money is available for up to FIVE years!
- A lot can happen in FIVE years!
- So, we highly encourage Seniors to apply today and try to meet the requirements!

What if I already have FL Prepaid or another scholarship?

- You cannot have too many scholarships!
- Once you decide on which college you plan to attend, all of your scholarship money will go into your financial aid account at the college.
- Your scholarship money will be applied towards your tuition, room & board, books, etc.
- Any extra money will be given BACK TO YOU! You can use that money for gas, a car payment, clothes, etc.

Florida Gold Seal Vocational (GSV) Award

The Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars (GSV) award may be funded if a student is enrolled in a career education or certificate program.

Examples: an Applied Technology Diploma, Technical Degree Ed Program (Associate in Applied Science or Associate in Science), or a Career Education Certificate Program.

To qualify for the GSV award must meet the following initial eligibility requirements:

- Achieve the required weighted minimum 3.0 GPA in the non-elective high school courses.
- Take at least 3 full credits in a single Career and Technical Education program.
- Achieve the required minimum 3.5 unweighted GPA in the career education courses.
- Achieve the required minimum score on the ACT®, SAT® or Florida Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (P.E.R.T.)
- Complete 30 volunteer service OR 100 paid work hours.
- Achieve the required minimum score on one of the college entrance exams per the chart no later than August 31 of the year the student graduates from high school.

Chapter 1: Eligibility

- ☐ You must **APPLY** for the scholarship by submitting the Florida Financial Aid Application. We are doing this today!
- ☐ Your Bright Futures Scholarship will renew automatically each year if you **maintain** the required GPA and credit hours.
- □ If you are planning to apply for Bright Futures, you should be accumulating **community service/work hours** and turning them in to the Guidance desk. Do not wait! Hours must be turned in before Graduation Day!
- ☐ You must submit the Volunteer Service Plan sheet with your hours. This form is on Ms. Richard's desk in Guidance.
- ☐ If possible, you should try to meet all Bright Futures requirements by the end of the **first** semester.

Chapter 1: Eligibility

- □ Remember, your Bright Futures GPA is **NOT** the same as your Bartram GPA.
- Bright Futures **weighs** honors, AP, and dual enrollment classes **equally** with 0.5 per credit earned NOT 1.0 weight
- ☐ Bright Futures will accept two additional academic electives toward the GPA calculation if it **benefits** the student.
- ☐ You are permitted to use qualifying scores from the ACT-CLT-SAT through **August 2026**, to qualify for the Bright Futures test requirement.



Institutional Financial Aid





Who should apply?

 EVERYONE! Talk to the college/university financial aid office to determine what programs for which you qualify. This is FIRST COME FIRST SERVED!

When should you apply?

• EARLY! Contact the college/university for their specific deadlines.

What does this application cover?

• Grants and Scholarships provided by the college/university.

What do you need?

• Usually, the FAFSA has to be filled out first, but contact the college/university to find out more information.

How do you apply?

• Colleges and Universities generally have a separate application process for financial aid.

Scholarship Tips

- Scholarships are available NOW!
- Apply to EVERY scholarship for which you are eligible.
- Make a list of deadlines and don't miss them!
- Review your social media accounts and remove inappropriate material.
- Create a dedicated scholarship email address: <u>FirstName.LastName@gmail.com</u> and make sure it's appropriate.

Scholarship Essay Tips

- Follow directions use accurate word count and font size, make sure to follow the requirements.
- Focus on the topic answer the question that is being asked, stick to the prompt and try approaching the topic in a creative way.
- Proofread and edit your work be clear, concise, and correct any errors.
- Get feedback ask a teacher or family member to read your essay and provide feedback.
- Essays can often be reused and tailored for each new scholarship.


You can search Google, just beware of Scams!

- Never give out bank account, credit card, or social security information.





- Review your Bright Futures Report.
- *Take note of what is "Missing" to qualify for each award.
- **❖** Take steps to improve your Bright Futures GPA if it is borderline. Finish any FLVS or Edmentum courses ASAP!
- **Take or re-take** ACT-CLT-SAT and report your scores to a Florida school. Remember Bright Futures super-scores your tests.
- Try to submit any remaining service/work hours by winter break.






- There are **TWO** sections to complete on the Bright Futures Application: first your STUDENT ACCOUNT and then the APPLICATION

- If you finish early, look for SCHOLARSHIPS on the School Counseling webpage Scholarships by monthly deadlines!


