What is a transcript?

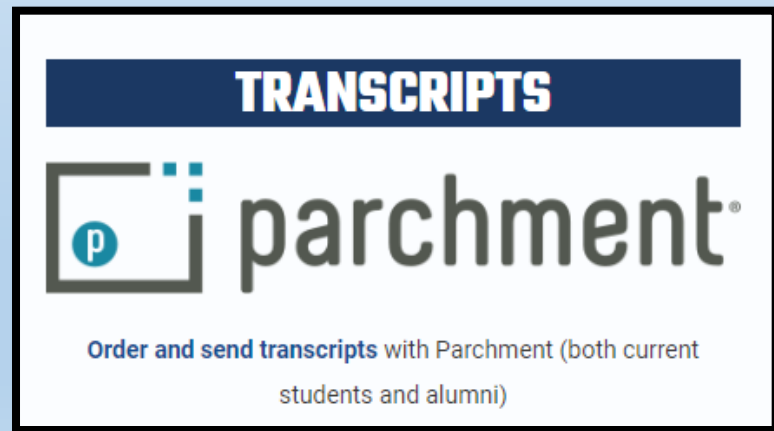
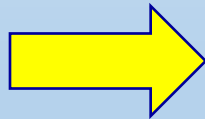
What is the difference between an **Official** transcript and an **Unofficial** transcript?

Unofficial = transcript is sent to the student/parent

Official = transcript is sent directly to a post-secondary institution, scholarship provider, etc.

½ credit must be **Economics**

HOPE (PE) – 1 credit

Performing/Fine Arts/CTE – 1 credit

Electives – 7.5 credits

Graduation Requirements

ASSESSMENTS

Required Assessments a student must PASS:

Grade 10 FSA - FAST

Level 3 or above

OR

one of the following **Concordant Options:**

Eng and Read Scores *39 on CLT Sum of Verbal Gram/Writing

B.E.S.T. - Algebra 1 EOC

Level 3 or above

OR

one of the following **Concordant Options:**

* 430 on PSAT/NMSQT Math * 420 on SAT Math
16 on ACT Math *16 on PreACT Math * Level 3 on Geom EOC
* 14 on CLT Quantitative Reasoning

Required Assessments a student must take:

Biology 1, Geometry, & US History*

*Students taking APUSH or DE US History are not required to
complete the EOC for a standard high school diploma.

**EOC's are needed for Scholar Designation on Diploma.

Scholar Diploma Designation

In addition to the requirements of s. [1003.4282](#), F.S., a student must satisfy the following requirements:

- Earn 1 credit in Algebra 2 or an equally rigorous course
- Pass the Geometry EOC
- Earn 1 credit in Statistics or an equally rigorous mathematics course
- Pass the Biology 1 EOC++
- Earn 1 credit in Chemistry or Physics
- Earn 1 credit in a course equally rigorous to Chemistry or Physics
- Pass the U.S. History EOC++
- Earn 2 credits in the same World Language
- Earn at least 1 credit in an AP, IB, AICE or a dual enrollment course

**Special note: A student is exempt from the Biology 1 or U.S. History EOC assessment if the student is enrolled in an AP, IB or AICE Biology 1 or U.S. History course; takes the respective AP, IB or AICE assessment and earns the minimum college credit.

Grade Forgiveness

- Students can retake classes in which they earned a “D” or “F” to earn grade forgiveness.
- Grades cannot be taken off a transcript, BUT the grade that is forgiven will not be included in the GPA calculation. The new grade will be calculated.
- Juniors should complete grade forgiveness **now**, before the beginning of their senior year.

- * **St. Johns Virtual School or Florida Virtual School**
- * **Edmentum – Credit Recovery program completed at home, or next year in the Edmentum Lab at school or at home**
(NCAA Student-Athletes cannot use Edmentum)

Dropping a Course

Counselors do not have the ability to change schedules!

The last day to request a change in your courses was the last day of school LAST YEAR!

Students may NOT drop a course due to difficulty OR for teacher preference.

District Policy is Students cannot drop a course unless:

- 1) The student has earned a 'D' or 'F' for the semester***
- 2) The student seeking consistent academic assistance from their teacher and***
- 3) There has been a parent conference with teacher***

Earning College Credit in High School

Advanced Placement

- Courses at Bartram Trail HS
- Over 25 AP Courses offered at BTHS, and most subjects covered, including electives
- 1.0 value added per credit
- Take AP Test in May; Scores range 1-5
- Generally, get AP credit for score of 3 or above
- It does **not** count towards your College GPA

Dual Enrollment

- Courses at St. Johns River State
- Three campuses: St. Aug, OP & Palatka
- Many courses are offered
- Courses fill up quickly!
- 1.0 value added per credit
- ACT/SAT/CPT/PERT score required
- 3.0 unweighted GPA required
- SJR State Application each semester
- Courses go on your college transcript permanently

Post-Secondary Options

Credential or Certificate

Community/State College – FSCJ, SJRSC, J-Tech

Examples of careers: automotive, welding, HVAC, cosmetology, EMS, fire fighting

State College (Two-Year, Associate Degree) – SJRCS, FSCJ, TCC, Valencia, Santa Fe

AS Degree – Two-year degree then straight into the workforce ◦ Examples of careers: nursing, air traffic controller, dental hygienist, radiological tech, IT

AA Degree – Two-year degree that transfers to a four-year college/university to earn Bachelor's Degree

Four Year College or University (Four-Year, Bachelor's Degree)

Master's Degree can be obtained after Bachelor's Degree

Doctorate Degree can be obtained after Master's Degree

Military – talk with Recruiters; ASVAB test

Common App & Xello

Common App is an online college application platform that most seniors use when applying to colleges.

St. John's County School District has partnered with Xello, a college and career software program that students can access through his/her Clever account . Xello allows students to complete interest and personality inventories, explore colleges and careers, track college applications, and much more.

Xello is also working in conjunction with Common App and is our primary program for completing college applications. This is how your school counselor will send your transcript and if needed, a counselor recommendation on your behalf.



Community Service and Work Hours

- Service hours are not a graduation requirement, but they are important for Bright Futures and for college applications.
- Community service hours must be documented on letterhead, signed by the supervisor, a parent and the student, and then submitted to Ms. Richards, the guidance secretary with a Volunteer Service Plan or 'Reflection Log' Reflection Log attached.
- Paid work hours are submitted by paystubs that total 100 paid work hours, and a Reflection Log attached (just the top section).
