FAST)

2.0 Cumulative, Unweighted
GPA

24 specific credits

Assessment Requirements for 24 Credit Diploma

Must pass two assessments to graduate

Algebra 1 BEST EOC (level 3 or above) or

- ACT Math – 16 or
- SAT Math – 420 or
- PSAT/NMSQT Math – 430 or
- FAST Geometry EOC – Level 3 or above
- CLT Quantitative Reasoning - 14

Grade 10 FAST/FSA ELA (level 3 or above) or

- ACT Reading and English average – 18 or
- SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing – 490
- PSAT Reading & Writing – 470 or
- CLT Sum of Verbal Reason & Grammar/Writing Sections - 39

GPA Requirement for 24 Credit Diploma



GPA - 2.0 cumulative unweighted or higher

2.0 is a "C" average

Check HAC regularly to keep track of grades

Credit/Grade Recovery is an option for students who earned a D or an F in a course to help bring their GPA up

Credit Requirements for Standard 24 Credit Diploma

- 24 credits must be earned in all the following:
 - ✓ English 1, 2, 3, and 4
 - ✓ Algebra, Geometry, and two additional math courses
 - ✓ Biology and two additional sciences
 - ✓ World History, US History, Government, and Economics
 - ✓ Practical/performing/fine arts/Career & Technical Education (CTE) course
 - ✓ HOPE (Health Opportunity through Physical Education)
 - ✓ 7.5 elective credits
 - ✓ If you're planning to attend a four-year university or meet eligibility requirements for the Bright Futures Scholarship, you will need two credits in the SAME world language
 - ✓ Personal Financial Literacy (.5 credits)
 - ✓ Beginning with students who started 9th grade in 23/24
 - ✓ We will offer Personal Finance and Money Management at BT
 - ✓ SJCSD recommends that students also take an accelerated course

Grades – A grade of “C” or better in the previous honors course. Students earning an “A” in a previous standard class, may be recommended for Honors or AP

FSA/FAST/EOC – Level 4 or 5 in appropriate area and not less than a level 3 in any area

SJCSD Honors Criteria



Dropping an AP or Honors Course

- Courses can only be dropped at the **semester** IF ...
 - Student has a D or F and
 - Student has consistently attended help sessions and
 - Parent and student have had a teacher conference and
 - There is a seat available in the desired course

Advanced Placement (AP)

- AP courses are open to any student who qualifies
 - Recommended level 4 or 5 on FSA/FAST ELA and EOC's, no less than a 3 in any area
 - Recommended previous honors experience
 - Teacher recommendation
- All classes taught on BTHS campus with BTHS teachers
- Transferability of Postsecondary credit: All Florida public postsecondary schools required to accept credit as specified in the credit by exam equivalences posted at:

Dual Enrollment with SJRSC

Keep in Mind

- Parents have no access to student's dual enrollment grades until they are added to both the college and high school transcript
- College professors/academic advisors will not communicate with parents
- All high school students who are taking dual enrollment classes are treated as an adult high college student and will be taking classes with adult college students
- High school counselors cannot advise on AA degree requirements or pre-requisites needed for intended majors
- Bartram Trail schedule cannot be modified or changed to accommodate dual enrollment classes

- Qualifying placement scores for math, reading, and writing

- Minimum Requirements
 - 11th or 12th grade
 - Good attendance and discipline record
 - 2.0 unweighted cumulative GPA
 - On track for graduation
 - Room in schedule (most 11th graders would need to complete several courses over the summer to make room on schedule)
 - Transportation to/from campus
- Guidelines for successful student outcomes
 - Motivated
 - Ability to adapt successfully to a college environment
 - Accountable for their attendance
 - Engaged/proactive learners
 - Self-advocacy

Accelerated Coursework

- Not required by the state for graduation, but recommended by SJCSD
 - Take an academy course and pass an Industry Certification Exam
 - Take an AP or AICE course and pass the associated AP/AICE exam
 - Take and pass a Dual Enrollment course with at least a C
 - Enroll in our ROTC program for at least two years and earn at least a 65 on the ASVAB

- Schools are required by the State to place students in intensive reading if they score a level 1 or 2 on the FAST ELA Reading
 - Administration will review FAST scores during the summer, and students will be placed in an intensive reading course.

Intensive Reading

Grade Forgiveness

Students can retake classes in which they earn a D or F (if the class is offered on FLVS, SJVS, or Edmentum Credit Recovery)

All grades appear on the official transcript. Forgiven grades will still show on transcript but will not be included in GPA calculation

All grade forgiveness should be completed before senior year

Options for grade recovery: St Johns Virtual School, Florida Virtual School, and/or Edmentum credit recovery*

*Courses taken via Edmentum credit recovery will not count towards NCAA eligibility

If grade forgiveness is necessary, students should request an Edmentum or Virtual Lab on their schedule for next school year during their meeting with the counselor

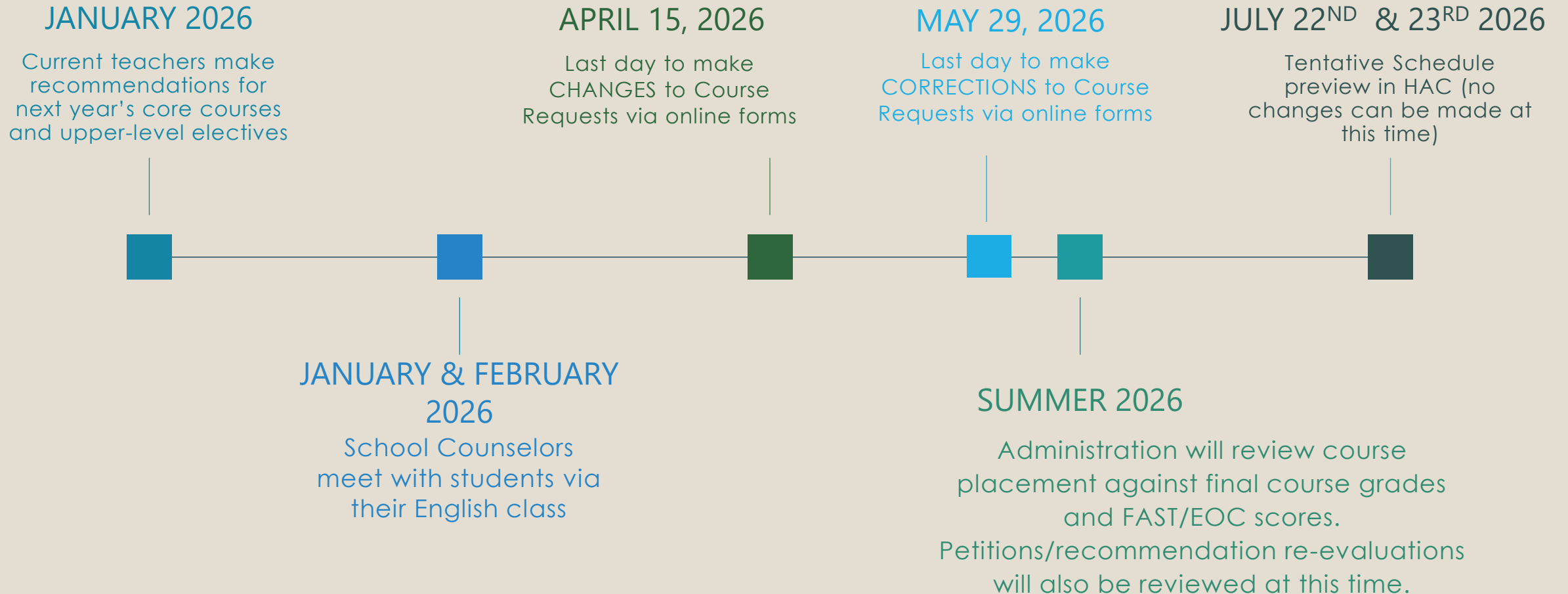

REGISTRATION TIMELINE



Recommendations vs Requests

Current teachers make recommendations for next year's core courses and upper-level electives.

- Feel free to look at our Course Progressions on our Registration webpage to see our recommended core course sequence.

Requests are the electives students get to pick to complete their 7 total courses for next year.

How to view Course Recommendations/Requests in HAC

1. January 16th-21st: Log into student HAC account using student username and password, NOT parent's login.
2. Select "Classes"
3. Select "Request" tab
4. Any course that is teacher recommended has a lock symbol next to it and cannot be changed. If students feel they have been recommended for the wrong course, they should discuss this during their appointment.
5. Choose elective classes. Total number of classes listed should be SEVEN.
6. All courses that students can choose from are listed under the "Electives" tab.
7. To select a course, click edit on the department row and select the box next to the class or classes you wish to ADD. Then select SAVE.
8. Once there is a total of 7 courses, you are done!

Student appointments via English classes

- All rising 10th-12th grade students have been scheduled for a 5-minute appointment to sit down with their school counselor to go over course requests.
- Students are welcome to call their parent on speaker phone during their appointment, so that their parent can be part of the conversation.
- The schedule of appointments was emailed home.
- If a student is absent for their appointment, a pass will be sent to your student with the make up meeting date and time.
- If you do not have an English class on campus a pass will be sent to your student with your scheduled meeting date and time.



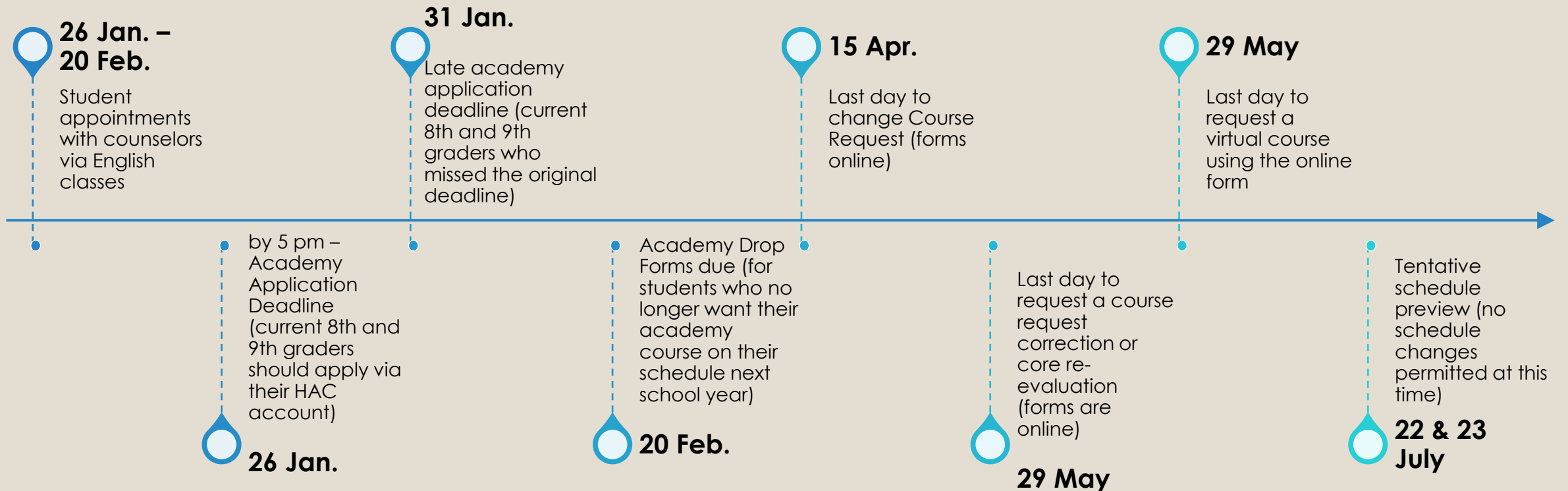
Request Changes & Schedule Changes

- Students can request the following changes when sitting with a counselor during their appointment:
 - Electives
 - Core Re-Evaluation
 - Virtual lab - deadline to request a virtual course with an August 10th start date via SJVS/FLVS is May 29th (last day of school)
- If changes need to be made after your registration appointment with your counselor, be sure to fill out the appropriate form on our website: <https://www-bths.stjohns.k12.fl.us/courseregistration/>
- There are **no schedule changes**, so make sure recommendations and requests are correct by May 29th (last day of school)

IMPORTANT DATES AND DEADLINES



Why the early deadline?

April 15th

- Course Request changes need to be submitted using the online forms by this date.
- After this date we build our master schedule based on what classes students have asked for and the district approves our staffing budget for the 26/27 school year.

May 29th

- Last day to request a Course Request Correction using our online forms.
- Changes after April 15th are based on seat availability, so there will be a high probability that these changes won't be approved.

FAQ's



- What if the student is sick on the day of the appointment?
 - Keep the student home, there will be make up days
- How do students know what electives are available?
 - There are listed in HAC. More details can be found here in the Course Catalog: <https://www-bths.stjohns.k12.fl.us/courseregistration/>
- What if the student doesn't want an elective they were recommended for?
 - Tell the counselor during the meeting and they can take it off, or fill out the online form
- Can the student request a specific teacher or lunch for next year?
 - No

FAQ's



- What happens if a student wants to take a lower-level class than the teacher recommended? Example: honors instead of AP
 - Tell the counselor during the meeting and they can change it, or fill out the form if the meeting has already taken place
- What happens if a student wants to take a higher-level class than the teacher recommended? Example: AP instead of honors
 - This can be discussed during the meeting with the school counselor. If a student qualifies for it, the request will be changed during the meeting. If student does not meet honors/AP criteria, fill out recommendation re-evaluation form; admin will review over summer.
- What if the student no longer wants to be in an academy elective?
 - Student will need to fill out the academy drop form with parent signature by the deadline
- Can current 10th or 11th grade students apply for an academy?
 - No

FAQ's



- What if the student wants to take a course virtually?
 - Students will need to request a virtual lab on their schedule during the appointment with the counselor AND request the course on FLVS or SJVS by 5/29. Student should enter August 10th as the start date of the course.
- What are the easy AP classes?
 - There are no easy AP classes. They are college level classes with college level expectations.
- What if a student changes their mind about a course after 4/15?
 - Fill out the only correction request, but keep in mind changes after 4/15 are based on seat availability.
- What if a student changes their mind about a course after 5/29?
 - It's too late, at that point all requests will be finalized for the schedule

FAQ's



- Can 9th and 10th graders get a reduced schedule, CO-OP (work program), or intern?
 - No
- Can 11th graders get a reduced/modified schedule?
 - Yes, they may have one modified period if they have four or more honors, AP, or dual enrollment courses.
- Can 12th graders get a reduced/modified schedule?
 - Yes, but we cannot guarantee they will get their choice of reduced (modified) periods
- Can 11th and 12th graders take Co-op (work program)?
 - Yes, Juniors and seniors who have at least a 2.0 GPA can take co-op. Juniors are limited to 1 period only. Students must submit pay stubs and work at least 5 hours per week, per co-op period.
- Who can be an intern (VPS)?
 - 12th graders with a weighted GPA of a 2.5 may have one intern period. Class earns community service hours, not credit.
