

Frequently Asked Questions- Graduation

- Parking- Graduates and guests will park in Lot 18. For DISABILITY PARKING ONLY- Lot 34/Garage 38. The cost of parking is included in Senior Dues, therefore there will be no charge at UNF to park.
- Arrival time- Doors will open at 1:30 pm (1 ½ hours prior to the ceremony) for both guests and graduates. Each guest must have a ticket for entry (children, age 2 and under who will sit on a lap do not require a ticket). Graduates do not require a ticket.
- Extra Tickets- There are no additional tickets. Graduates/families in search of additional tickets must network with other graduate/families.
- Bag Policy- UNF has a strict clear bag policy. A **small** clutch or wristlet is also permitted. Leave purses, grad gifts at home or in locked vehicle.
- Mag-gate security- All graduates and guests will go through a mag-gate upon entering the Field House or Arena. Wanding will be used in instances that the mag-gate is triggered during a walk-through.
- Seat Saving- There is a zero-tolerance policy on saving seats. Guests who wish to sit together should plan to arrive together and early for the ceremony.
- Disability Seating- There are designated areas on the main floor as well as the 2nd level. Those who present a need will be assisted by House Staff. One companion seat is provided (this must also be a ticketed guest). Sign language interpreters will also be near the stage. House Staff will direct those with a need to the designated seating area.
- Prohibited items- Including but not limited to: Gifts, flowers, balloons, poster signs, outside food or drink (unless medical in nature).
 - Concessions, flowers, and balloons will be available for sale within the Arena.
- Expectations & Standards of Behavior- It is expected that graduates and guests will maintain an acceptable level of decorum. Please refrain from:
 - Behavior that is unruly, disruptive, or illegal in nature
 - Foul or abusive language or obscene gestures
 - Verbal or physical harassment toward anyone
 - Interference with the progress of the ceremony
