

PLEASE READ THIS INFORMATION CAREFULLY

Advanced Placement (AP) examinations commence on Monday, May 4, 2026, and continue through May 15, 2026. It is extremely important that students arrive on time and know the testing schedule. Included in this message is the schedule for all exams.

The exam schedule cannot be altered, and students are expected to attend their scheduled exams. Students who fail to attend their regularly scheduled exams are subject to fees imposed by College Board. These fees begin at \$40 and are charged to Bartram Trail High School; therefore, students who miss a scheduled examination will be required to pay any accrued fees for missed examinations, late testing requests, etc. before sitting for the missed examination.

Examples of when fees may be imposed (this list is not all inclusive):

- *Students who miss their exams for any reason*
- *Students who are late for their exams and require late testing*
- *Students who wish to move their exam dates to “Late Testing” for personal conflicts*
- *Students who choose not to test*

Morning Testing: Doors open at 7:45 a.m.

All students should arrive at Bartram Trail High School by 7:45 am on any test date that shows an 8:00 am start time. All students will enter through the doors located between the gymnasium and front office (located by the drop off circle/main entrance). See map attached. **Students may not enter any testing room once the test administrator has begun reading the test day script.** Late students WILL NOT be admitted into testing, and this will be recorded as a missed examination.

Afternoon Testing: Doors will open at 11:45 am

BTHS students with classes in the morning: BTHS students will be released from class at 11:00 a.m. for lunch. Lunch will be available for purchase in the cafeteria. BTHS students will remain in the courtyard until it is time for the afternoon testing session to begin.

BTHS students with morning modified schedules AND Non-BTHS students: Any student taking an afternoon exam should arrive at Bartram Trail High School by 11:45 am on any test date that shows a 12:00 pm start time. Students will enter through the doors located between the gymnasium and front office (located by the drop off circle/main entrance). See map attached. **Students may not enter any testing room once the test administrator has begun reading the test day script.** Late students WILL NOT be admitted into testing, and this will be recorded as a missed examination.

Any student who has both a morning and afternoon exam is strongly encouraged to pack a lunch/snacks on that day. Time may be limited for a student to purchase lunch in the cafeteria or to have a full lunch break.

Late Testing:

Students who require late testing for any reason must speak with the AP Coordinator in advance, so the exams can be ordered. Please note, that in addition to College Board imposing a fee, students who require late testing must be prepared for dates to possibly interfere with other planned events (graduation, other exams, etc.) Late testing dates are determined by College Board not by the AP Coordinator or school.

Testing Room Locations:

Students with standard testing times will test in the gymnasium with a few exceptions.
Please see below:

May 4: AP European History – Room N232/N236

May 5: AP Chemistry – Wrestling Room

May 7: AP Physics 2 – Wrestling Room

May 13: AP Spanish Literature – Room 945

May 14: AP Spanish Language – Wrestling Room

BTHS Students with approved College Board testing accommodations will receive a test location card, which will identify all AP testing rooms for that student.

Items Needed for test days:

- Identification – Driver’s License, Driver’s Permit, School ID, Passport (these items cannot be digital) In all national testing situations an ID is necessary. Please ensure in advance that proper identification is available.
- **Students MUST know their College Board login information to take digital and hybrid exams.** All students have an account. It is strongly suggested that they memorize or have their login information available to them on test day. (Video - [College Board Student Accounts](#))
- #2 Pencils, blue/black Pens
- Calculator - Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Micro, Macro, Statistics, Pre-Calculus, Physics only. ([AP Exams Calculator Policy – AP Students | College Board](#))
- A ruler - for tests that allow a ruler. No protractors allowed.

- Layers of clothing (It could be 80+ degrees in the gym/testing rooms, or it could be 65 degrees. It's unpredictable)
- Water/Snacks
- Bagged lunch - if you have two exams in the same day, or if you have a morning extended time test. You might consider bringing a "snack/lunch" that you can eat throughout the day if you are taking multiple tests.
- **All examinees will use BTHS issued technology for digital and hybrid exams.**

What Not To Bring:

- Backpack/Large Bag - if at all avoidable.
- Test Prep Books/Class Notes/Textbooks/etc.
- Cell Phones/Smartwatches - The official College Board policy is no phones in the testing room. Any cell phones, air pods, headphones, etc. that make it to the testing room will be turned off, collected, and returned to you after all exams have been collected. If you do not want us to take it, don't bring it at all.
- Mechanical Pencils
- Anything that makes noise.
- Anything that covers your head (hoodie, hat)

College Board requires that all students accept the terms and conditions. You will be asked for confirmation of your agreement to these terms as part of your test on exam day.

Parking:

- BTHS students should park in their assigned parking spaces.
- Visiting students and any BTHS student who does not have an assigned parking space should park in the spaces highlighted on the attached map.
- **No one is permitted to park in ANY numbered space if it is not assigned to them. These parking spaces are assigned to staff and students and will result in a ticket.**

Pick – Up Arrangements:

Please note that many AP exams are more than 3 hours long. **Exams on Wednesday, May 6 & Wednesday, May 13, will end after school has been released.** Please plan student transportation in advance. In addition, **students with extended time for afternoon testing sessions will generally complete testing after students have been released from school.** Please plan accordingly.

Non- BTHS Students:

Please ensure you know what date(s) you are testing. There will be a check point when you enter by the gym and you must have a picture ID for us to verify your identity. Designated parking areas have been identified on the attached map. Do not park in any numbered spaces.

Early Release:

BTHS students who plan to leave school after testing is complete, must have their parent/guardian complete the early release form found on the BTHS website, no later than 10:30 a.m. on the requested early release date. We are NOT accepting hand-written notes or emails. Parents will need to complete the form and enter **“AP Testing”** for question #9. Students will not receive an early release pass. Students will check out at the Dean’s office if their parent completed the form.

It is the student’s responsibility to know his/her testing schedule and testing locations. The school will not seek out students who are not present for their examinations. Students will be marked as absent.
