8 Elective Credits (8)






### Schedule Preview July 17-20<sup>th</sup>

This is an opportunity to make sure that your student has been scheduled for all the correct courses.

#### **Schedule Changes will not be approved for:**

- Teacher Preference
- Class period preference
- Lunch preference
- Students who do not meet honors criteria and request advanced level courses
- Elective changes (that were not made prior to March 13<sup>th</sup>)
- Dropping core/elective courses for a modified period







#### First Day of School

#### Monday, August

Only schedule changes that pertain to GRADAUTION REQUIREMENTS will be entertained on the first day of school.

It is our intention that every student have their full year schedule in place on the first day of school.

#### MODIFIED SCHEDULES

#### Juniors (1 modified period):

- Must be in good standing
- 4 of more DE/AP Courses on Schedule

#### Seniors:

- Must be in good standing (all graduation requirements met/on schedule)
- Must have 4 courses on schedule to be considered a BTHS student

#### **CO-OP SCHEDULES**

#### <u>CO – OP</u>

Juniors (1 CO-OP Period)

- Must have job that your student earns 5 hours per week
- Turn in pay stubs & 4 assignments per semester
- Earns a grade for course but can leave campus during that period


Seniors (1-3 CO-OP Periods)

- Same criteria as juniors
- Must earn 5 hours per week per period at job
