Graduation Requirements for incoming 9th graders

24 credits must be earned in all the following:

- English 1, 2, 3, and 4
- Algebra, Geometry, and two additional math courses
- Biology and two additional sciences
- World History, US History, Government, and Economics
- 1 Practical/performing/fine arts/Career & Technical course
- HOPE
- .5 credits in Personal Financial Literacy
- 7.5 elective credits If you're planning to attend college, you will need two credits in the SAME world language


2.0 unweighted, cumulative GPA

Must pass two assessments – Algebra 1 EOC and 10th grade FAST-ELA

What counts as a Performing, Practical, Fine Art or Career & Technical Education (CTE) course?



Students only need 1.0 credit for graduation. Any additional PF/PA/CTE courses on transcript will count towards electives.

Math – Science Placement

- Environmental Science and Algebra 1
- Physical Science Honors and Algebra 1 Honors
- Biology Honors and Geometry Honors

World Language

- We offer ASL and Spanish
- In order to take Spanish freshman year, students must be enrolled in English 1 Honors

Grades – A grade of "C" or better in the previous honors (Adv in Middle School) course. Students earning an "A" in a previous standard class, may be recommended for Honors or AP

FAST/EOC – Level 4 or 5 in appropriate area and not less than a level 3 in any area

BTHS Course Requests: Hybrid Format

- **1. 8**th **Grade Night**: Tonight, you are going to walk around and learn about all our elective options.
- 2. HAC Electives: Students choose electives in HAC, Feb 21st 28th. Students will also be able to see the core courses they were recommended for during that window.
- 3. Middle School Visits: If you have questions, your student can ask them during our middle school visit, or you can even join in. Meeting schedule will be emailed home.



Course Requests

HAC will show all the classes that have been **recommended by your current teachers**. If you are missing a core class, you will need discuss that during your registration meeting.

Students choose their electives, so they will have a total of 7 course requests. Step-by-step directions for entering course requests will be emailed home.

It is important that your student **choose electives wisely**, as schedules will not be changed in August.

If you need to change a course request after HAC closes or after the School Visit, you have **until April 15th to fill out the appropriate online Forms**. Links to all Forms will also be emailed home.

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
Students should confirm in HAC they have 7 courses and everything looks accurate before their scheduled visit day.
